Note: if you save the files on your computer as \*.midi, you can then open in Windows Media Player and change the speed at which you want to play the files. A handy tip below:

1. Play a file, and then switch to Now Playing mode. If you're in the Player Library, click the Switch to Now Playing button in the **lower-right corner** of the Player.
2. Right-click an open space in the Player (such as to the left of the Stop button) , point to Enhancements, and then click Play speed settings.
3. Move the Play Speed slider to the speed at which you want to play the file, or click the Slow, Normal, or Fast links. To select speeds between the labelled play speeds, in the Play speed settings dialog box, clear the Snap slider to common speeds check box.
4. To hide the settings, click the Close button in the Play speed settings dialog box.

The Puccini “cyberbass” files can be played at a suitable speed directly from the website.

If you want to listen to the youtube videos as posted by members already, there IS a way to slow them down. Go to youtube and select the piece you want to listen to, then see below to alter the play settings:
